A NEW PLAGUE

It was a warm summer night. The sky was clear and the stars shone like lanterns floating in an endless black sea. The crickets in the grass chirped, the owls in the trees hooted, and the frogs in the pond croaked. Any perfect summer night about five years ago would've been like this one, but now there is quiet in the night. The crickets may still chirp and the owls may still hoot, but the overwhelming croaking of frogs is gone. No longer can children catch toads, frogs, and salamanders. Our little amphibian friends are disappearing.

The population of all amphibians has declined by 6.5% due to a disease called chytridiomycosis, which is caused by a chytrid fungus known as Batrachochytrium dendrobatidis (Bd). Ninety different types of amphibian species have gone extinct, making this disease the most destructive in the world. The loss of these amphibians may not seem like a big deal, but if they ever go extinct there will be major changes to the ecosystem, and in turn, our own lives.

Dr. Rowley, a biologist who has been studying amphibians in South-East Asia, explained that, "In places where we've lost amphibians, we immediately notice the ecosystem-level effects: other animals starving to death and water courses clogging up, etc. Nothing really steps up to fill the role of frogs." She also explained that frogs are used as an indicator species by scientists to figure out how healthy a particular environment is because frogs control pests, filter water, and feed other animals.

Bd starts out as a spore that is capable of swimming, called a zoospore. The zoospore can travel short distances of one to two centimeters in water before they need to find a host. Once they do find a host, they create a cyst in the host's skin and feed off of the nutrients in the keratin layer of the skin. Then the zoospore begins its reproductive cycle. Once there are new little zoospores, they either re-infect the current host or find a different amphibian to feed off of. After a frog is infected with a Bd zoospore they eventually die from cardiac arrest. Most infected frogs are hard to tell apart from healthy ones, but some may show signs of seizures, shedding skin, or discolored skin.

Little has been found out on how to help amphibians. Scientists are trying to

Valentine's Day Playlist





A New Plague



There were massive plague outbreaks in the 1720s, 1820s, and 1920s. Many people are claiming the coronavirus to be the plague of 2020. The coronavirus is not an unheard of disease, but the recent outbreak has been far more severe than any previous flare-ups. Coronaviruses get their name from their crown-like shape, and they usually include respiratory symptoms similar to the common cold. As of January 31st, 2020, over 9,700 people have been infected. This number has more than tripled since January 27th, when the total was just 3,000. The illness is rapidly spreading, and it does not seem to be slowing down anytime soon.

Coronaviruses are a large family of viruses that are very common. The viruses often infect humans as well as animals, but animals rarely infect humans. As previously stated, symptoms of a coronavirus infection are very similar to those of a common cold. A victim might experience a fever, cough, runny rose, sore throat, or shortness of breath anywhere between two and fourteen days after exposure. This new strain of coronavirus is rapidly spreading through China, and several cases have already been detected in twenty-two other countries, as of January 31st.

In the United States, there are six confirmed cases, mainly on the West Coast. All but one of the patients are confirmed to be kept in isolation from the general public. Additionally, a flight of 201 Americans were evacuated from Wuhan, the epicenter of the coronavirus outbreak, early on the morning of the 29th. They landed in Anchorage, Alaska before going on to land in Southern California. They are being held at the Air Force base until they have been screened by health officials.

As of January 31st, 213 confirmed deaths have been caused by the coronavirus in China. The infection begins in the upper respiratory tract and behaves like a head cold, but can spread to the lower tract and cause fatal pneumonia. The illness has mainly killed the young and the elderly, or anyone with heart disease or a compromised immune sys-SEE **CORONAVIRUS**, PG. 6 figure out how to stop and eliminate Bd, but it's complicated. Getting rid of some mushrooms in the garden may be easy if you have some fungicide, but when that fungus is all over the world, with the exception of Papua New Guinea and a few other countries here and there, it's a little harder. Plus, Bd is infecting living animals and being passed on from host to host in more ways than can be controlled. One of the biggest reasons Bd has spread all over the world is the pet and meat trade. Frogs and other creatures are sold and traded all over the world to be used as pets, experiments, and sometimes food. This constant moving of animals helps the fungus reach new sites and eventually new hosts.

Luckily, scientists from the Zoological Society of London, The National Museum of Natural History in Spain, and Imperial College London were able to eliminate Bd from some Mallorcan midwife toads. The toads were placed in a disinfected environment and treated with an antifungal and were cleared of the infection. Of course, this would be a lot harder to do with every frog in the world, but perhaps if a few of each species were able to be treated, then there would be some hope of preserving them.

What now? Well, there may not be a way to stop Bd completely, but there is a way to preserve the genetics of species whose numbers are declining. The Frozen Ark project takes skin cells and other genomes from species that are threatened with extinction and puts them in what is basically a cryogenic chamber. With these samples, sometime in the future when we have the technology to create life from gene samples, kind of like in Jurassic Park, we may be able to bring any species that go extinct back to life. The Frozen Ark has preserved DNA from hundreds of endangered and extinct animals. A few of the samples from the Frozen Ark project are from tree snails, a species of Hawaiian snail that sadly went extinct in 2018, snow leopards, a rare type of big cat that are endangered but no one knows exactly how many are left in the wild because of how hard it is to find them, elephants, and many more species.

In 2013, Australian scientists were able to bring an extinct species of frog back to life, temporarily. They brought back the gastric brooding frog, which went extinct from chytrid Bd, because this special type of frog turned its stomach into a uterus and grew its fertilized eggs inside of it until they because fully-fledged frogs and then projectile vomited them out. The scientists brought the frog back using somatic cell nuclear transfer, which is when the nucleus of a cell from an extinct species is put into the egg of another type of that species that has had its DNA removed. This is the same process that was used to clone Dolly the sheep, except with an extinct species. Unfortunately, the embryos only survived for three days, but scientists are still working on getting the embryos to become tadpoles.

Save The Frogs is a project that is working to bring frogs back to America by creating 1,000 wetlands within a decade. They say that anyone can build a wetland in their own backyard to help attract frogs. They say the best way to create a wetland is to dig a shallow hole and put either some sort of plastic cover or water retaining soil at the bottom, fill it with water, and add some natural plants. Fish and non-native frogs must not be added to the wetland as they will compete with the native frogs for food. Also, pesticides should be avoided not only in your wetland but around your house in general. With all of this put into place, your backyard should start seeing more frogs and you should start seeing less bugs, and hopefully we can help stop a plague that is threatening one of our most important species.

Groundhog Day is a tradition celebrated on February 2nd, mainly by the German population that immigrated to America from Europe in the 1700s. Many Germans immigrated to Pennsylvania where the city Punxsutawney is home to the largest celebration of Groundhog Day. The tradition, before it came to America, followed the behavior of the hedgehog, but the absence of hedgehogs turned the role of the weather forecaster over to the American groundhog. The animal swap was only a slight variation to the tradition, but even before the Germans had this tradition, the holiday can trace its roots even farther back to a Catholic holiday called Candlemas Day.

Candlemas Day lies in between the Winter Solstice and the Spring Equinox. The holiday celebrates the redemption of the first-born, Jesus Christ, and the purification of Mary. Because Jesus is the light of the world, they celebrate this day with candles. There was a poem written about Candlemas Day saying, "If Candlemas be fair and bright, come winter, have another flight. If Candlemas bring clouds and rain, go winter, and come not again." Nobody knows the origin of the thought in which a sunny day on February 2nd meant more winter and a cloudy day meant an early spring. Farmers would use this as a weather predictor. February 2nd is right at the midpoint of Winter. Hedgehogs, a

Farmers in the area attached the Candlemas poem to the hedgehog's behavior, turning this into its very own tradition. When German immigrants came to America they found no hedgehogs, so there after the groundhog became the replacement due to how common they were. Many of these immigrants settled in Pennsylvania and it was in 1887 that the beloved seer of seers; prognosticator of all prognosticators, Punxsutawney Phil was born. Phil is the everlasting groundhog that is celebrated in the city of Punxsutawney. Phil is the official weather forecasting groundhog when it comes to the holiday Groundhog Day.

Groundhog Day is a fun tradition, but not the most accurate. On average, Punxsutawney Phil is right only 39 percent of the time. He has predicted a long winter 103 times and an early spring 19 times. After a 2016 referendum vote, Britain has been trying to leave the European Union (EU). The EU has been an economic and political burden on the United Kingdom, and the people want to get out. The process of Britain's exit has been termed Brexit, and the overwhelming conservative victory in the United Kingdom's recent election is likely to ensure their departure. The EU nations' economies and policies have been woven together for decades, so undoing that is going to be a long and difficult process.

The EU was created after the end of World War II to make Europe one cohesive economic and political powerhouse. It was also intended to prevent future world wars by effectively unifying all of Europe. The EU originally had only six members: Belgium, France, Germany, Italy, Luxembourg, and the Netherlands. Over the years, the economic and political community gained more members and even adopted the Euro as a shared currency. Britain was a reluctant member and took decades to agree to full membership and was the last to accept the Euro. Still, there were many issues within the Union. One of the bigger issues was the sovereign debts of several countries. Both Ireland and Portugal have each been bailed out of bankruptcy once, and since just 2008, Greece has gone bankrupt twice and needed to be bailed out. The U.K. has begun to grow resentful of the financial drain and political chains associated with being part of the EU.

The Conservatives in Britain had an overwhelming victory in the 2019 elections, further cementing the reality of Brexit. Now, with a solid majority in Parliament, Prime Minister Boris Johnson can continue pushing for his revised withdrawal agreement. The proposal is essentially divorce paperwork between the U.K. and the EU;itdiscusses the transition time, exit payments, citizens' rights, and various policies.

President Trump's shocking win in 2016 was an indicator of the rise of nationalism around the globe. Boris Johnson has been able to use this to his advantage. He, along with a majority of British people, want to make England great again. Being in the EU limits the amount of trade deals Britain can make independently, and it forces them to operate according to strict political guidelines, which at times has been in direct opposition to the welfare of the British people. An example of this is the EU's requirement to take in refugees from the Syrian Civil War. Britain is also fearful of an EU dominated by Germany and France, who traditionally have had foreign policies that are not in England's best interests.

In-N-Out Burger is a very successful fast-food chain that is located mainly on the West Coast. They have restaurants in six different states, California, Arizona, Nevada, Utah, Texas, and recently Oregon. There are three Oregon locations in Medford, Grants Pass, and Keizer. This beloved restaurant has been open since 1948, marking its 72nd anniversary.

In-N-Out is no ordinary restaurant. All their produce is completely fresh, never being frozen or reheated. This Day in History: February 14th -Happy Birthday YouTube!-

The second most used search engine, the second most visited site, and the second most popular social media platform, YouTube, was created on February 14th, 2005. Billions of people use YouTube for various reasons, most commonly to watch and publish videos. Anyone with some sort of camera and a phone or a computer can make a video about whatever they want. There is a large diversity of videos so that anyone can find something to watch.

YouTube was created on February 14th, 2005, by three former PayPal employees Chad Hurley, Steve Chen, and Jawed Karim. They realized that there wasn't a single video sharing platform and Sequoia Capital thought so too. Sequoia Capital invested \$11.5 million in the site. Then, once the beta testing period had finished, Nike uploaded the first video to reach one million views. Just a year later, Google bought YouTube for \$1.65 billion, and that was before it even reached the UK.

In 2009, gaming videos rose to interest. There was finally a place for all gamers to assemble and share about video games. They could learn from one another, teach each other, and for some gamers who may not have the money for a fancy computer and expensive games, they could experience everything on YouTube via playthroughs. Now, the second most subscribed to channel, with over 100 million subscribers, is a gaming channel. While many old gamers have changed what kind of content they upload, there are still plenty of gaming videos.

While all this may seem amazing, YouTube has had many policy changes over the past few years that many creators and viewers don't appreciate. The copyright policy is one of many that most people do not like. If just a few seconds of a song, movie, show, or anything that can that has a copyright or patent is in a video, the video can be claimed as a copyright infringement and blocked from users.

A recent problem for the YouTube committee that is upsetting a lot of people is a policy that was put into action in September, 2019. Google and YouTube received a lawsuit from the FTC for violating the Children's Online Privacy Protection Act Rule (COPPA). This rule entails that children under the age of thirteen cannot have personal information collected from them, which is what Youtube and Google do for directed ads. With the application of this policy creators now have to mark their videos either for children or not for children. Channels that are directed to children are now in trouble, because their videos can no longer have ads on them, which is where the majority of revenue for the creators comes from. Without ads, there's no money, and without money, there's no videos.

Despite these problems YouTube is still going strong. After only 15 years it has become a worldwide phenomenon and a part of our lives that many can't even imagine living without.

tem. There is no vaccine for the coronavirus, but the National Institutes of Health is attempting to develop one within the next few months. 
In the year 1200 A.D., famous Mongolian warrior and ruler, Genghis Khan created a mail delivery service within the Mongolian Empire called the Ortoo. The Ortoo was a communication and postal relay system that the Mongol army relied on. The route was spread over 12 million square miles and had postal stations every 20 to 30 miles. Along with the stations was a central building and a bathroom where the riders delivering mail could rest and get food along with a corral for their animals to be put up and fed. The rider had the option to hand off his message to another rider or he could grab another horse and keep going. By using this method, messages could be delivered very quickly.

The Mongolian warriors relied on fast delivery because it was their only way of communication with their government. At the rate that the riders would travel, a message could be delivered across the empire in four to six weeks, and that's not rushing the delivery. If a message was to be delivered to the battlefield, the riders would use arrows to reach their final destination. The warriors would also use flags and music for communication. This allowed them to not give away their plan of attack to their enemies.

The Ortoo messengers greatly depended on their animals, and those animals had to be in excellent condition at all times to cover the vast distances they traveled. By the end of Kublai Khan's rule in 1294 A.D., the Ortoo had more than 1,400 postal stations, 50,000 horses, 1,400 oxen, 6,700 mules, 6,000 boats, over 200 dogs and 1,150 sheep. In Mongolia, animals were very important for their source of milk, hide, meat, and many other things. The Ortoo used the animals not only for those reasons, but obviously for the use of travel. Horses were the most commonly used, but oxen, although slower, were used for heavier loads.

Even though the Pony Express is far more well-known than the Ortoo, the Ortoo was just as fast as the Pony Express and covered a much larger area. Pony Express riders would ride 75 to 100 miles per day, changing their horse every 10 to 12 miles and the riders would travel around speeds of 15 to 25 miles per hour. The fastest recorded 100 miles with the Pony Express took the rider 7 days and 17



Singer and guitarist Danny Scordato credits his inspiration to, "Steely Dan for their complex music and storytelling, Prince for his overall funkiness and creativeness, and of course The Beatles for the best melodies in the game." 

To put it into perspective, the Ortoo could travel the whole Mongolian Empire at the same speed, but had a delivery area which was just over 12 million square miles from end to end. You can make the case that the Ortoo was far faster and had much larger of an organization.

The last time that long distance mail was delivery by horse in the U.S. was at the conclusion of the Pony Express on October 24, 1861. They were replaced by at first trains, and later on trucks, airplanes, and automobiles. Local delivery by horse was still common all the way into the 20th Century.

We shouldn't overlook how amazing our modern delivery service is today, or under appreciate the dedicated men and women who provide this service. But, it's good to know that even if our modern technology should fail, the human need for rapid communication will find a solution. The Ortoo are proof of that! **FEBRUARY 14, 2020**

For a delightful Valentine's Day treat, look no further, for this chocolate mousse is everything you are looking for and so much more. With the perfect texture and a rich chocolate flavor that isn't too overpowering, it will be a perfect addition to your special day.

Ingredients:

- 6 oz. semisweet chocolate, finely chopped
- 6 tbsp. unsalted butter, cubed
- 4 egg yolks
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 2 tsp. vanilla extract
- 1 cup heavy cream
 - Whipped cream, chocolate shavings, strawberries, for garnish

Directions:

Begin by grabbing a medium sized pot and fill it a quarter of the way full of water. Place this on the stovetop on medium heat. While waiting for it to reach a boil, grab a heatproof bowl that will fit over the top of the pot without touching the water. In that bowl add the chocolate and butter. Set this over the pot when it has reached a small boil and stir the chocolate continuously until it is melted and smooth. Once at this stage, remove from heat and set aside, but leave the pot of water simmering. In another bowl, similar to the size of the last, whisk together the egg yolks and sugar. Once well combined, set over the pot of water and whisk frequently until the mixture turns pale and thickens slightly, then remove from the heat once done. Then, stir the vanilla into the bowl of eggs and sugar, followed by the chocolate. Stir for a few more minutes, and set aside to cool. Next, grab a large bowl and in that whip the heavy cream to soft peaks. Once the egg and chocolate mixture has reached room temperature, add ¼ of the whipped cream to it and whisk together. After that, gently fold in the remaining whipped cream. Divide this mixture into the desired amount of cups and refrigerate for at least an hour. Once set, top with whipped cream and any other garnish of your choosing, grab a spoon and enjoy!

Growing up, doing things for the first time is a big deal. It puts you onto a path for your future and changes how you perceive and act in the real world as well as throughout your life. Unfortunately, many of our nation's youth are participating in adult behavior way before they are ready for it. By the age of 13, it's relatively common to have had your first sexual experience (including intercourse), and to experiment with drugs and alcohol. Although this isn't uncommon behavior, what does it mean for the developing child? What are the risks and long-term effects?

The National Institute on Drug Abuse's 2017 'Monitoring the Future Survey' found that 23% of 8th graders drank alcohol regularly and 37% use other various drugs such as Marijuana, LSD, Amphetamines, and Inhalants regularly. Not only that, the peak of beginning drug use is around 8th grade. It

had also been found that 41% to 73% of children have had sexual experiences by the time they reach age 13. These activities cause emotional distress and are unhealthy for a child.



 Protecting Pedophiles


As a society, we have become so fixated on not offending others that mass media outlets, specifically Twitter, have even begun to create safe spaces for pedophilia. Twitter has banned numerous popular political voices like Milo Yiannopoulos, Alex Jones, and Laura Loomer simply for being "too offensive," yet they allow for pedophiles, or "minor attracted persons" (MAPs), to freely use their platform. Absurdly, offensiveness is banned and considered hate speech, but pedophilia is accepted and considered a sexual orientation. At what point does political correctness begin to endanger the public?

Twitter's policy change regarding pedophilia has recently resurfaced on social media. Dr. James Cantor, a homosexual and advocate for MAPs, co-wrote a letter demanding for the normalization of non-offending pedophiles. Twitter seems to agree with this line of thinking and now explicitly allows for pedophiles to discuss the sexual exploitation of children. The letter said that preventing a support network from being formed is, "Likely to increase the stigma and isolation associated with pedophilia and thereby increase the likelihood of some MAPs acting on their sexual feelings." His idea is that allowing pedophiles to have a support network will increase the safety of children, but in reality, normalizing and destigmatizing pedophilia is likely to place even more children in danger.

The policy allows for, "Discussions related to child sexual exploitation as a phenomenon or attraction towards minors are permitted, provided they don't promote or glorify child sexual exploitation in any way." Twitter is also allowing for nude photographs or images of minors, provided that they are, "Artistic depictions of nude minors in a non-sexualized context or setting may be permitted in a limited number of scenarios e.g., works by internationally renowned artists that feature minors." This essentially means that pedophiles can talk about how much they want to interact with children, or about how they find children sexually attractive, but they cannot "promote" it. Twitter's policy statement seems to be if not a promotion of pedophilia, it is at least an acceptance of it.

The pedophiles' main argument is that they deserve a voice and a platform because they are not breaking any laws. Following that logic then, Milo Yiannopoulos shouldn't have been banned either because he did not break any laws. He said a lot of offensive things, but he never threatened anybody or committed any crimes. Twitter banned him because of his trolling of the all-female Ghostbusters cast and the influence he had over his followers. Yiannopoulos repeatedly called the cast fat and ugly, and Twitter thinks that is less acceptable than being sexually attracted to children. It is absurd and disappointing that Twitter will literally allow pedophilia, but ban any and all mildly offensive media.

At the end of the day, pedophilia is still a mental illness, not a sexuality, and the non-offending afflicted should be allowed to seek help without consequences. While I acknowledge that some pedophiles may be afraid to seek mental health treatment in fear of penalties, I still do not think that Twitter is the proper place for them to network, especially considering that Twitter's minimum age requirement is 13 years. It is ridiculous that Twitter is so accepting of pedophiles, yet so intolerant of Milo's legal expressions of opinion. We live in a sad and twisted world where the freedom to express one's illegal sexual attraction towards children is protected, but the expression of an offensive, but otherwise legal, opinion is banned.

Today, China is the largest importer of goods into the U.S. Over the last 50 years, they have shown some of the largest economic growth in human history. China has been a cheap alternative for U.S. made goods and many companies move production lines to China. This is because they don't have as many regulations on employees like the U.S. does. As more and more people outsource to China, shipping and producing becomes more and more expensive. Eventually, investors will need to find somewhere else with a high population to manufacture cheap goods, and India will be the answer. With a high population that's desperate for work, they could cheaply produce goods. India has also experienced some growth in the last 50 years, but nothing as significant as China.

China has the advantage of having large quantities of natural resources that India simply doesn't have. Large amounts of iron, rare earth metals, and fossil fuels give China all the ingredients for a large and thriving economy. They are the 2nd largest country in terms of exports and China has proved to be a lucrative market for people who want to produce goods at a cheap price. The problem however, is that the Chinese market is becoming more and more competitive, and therefore, more expensive. Combine that with an oppressive and controlling government and trade becomes difficult.

India is the largest democracy in the world, and while it has some tariffs and regulations, they are much easier to do business with than China. Comparatively, India does not have the resources that China has, and most of its economy is based on agriculture. Because of this, India has had a hard time industrializing. This does not mean they won't, but instead it means they are going to have to import goods from nations who have natural resources readily available. Investing in India is extraordinarily cheap. With a large population and a blossoming middle class, now would be the best time to outsource to India. India has the 2nd largest English speaking population, and this is to their benefit as English is the language of business.

The big question here is which you should outsource to, and which country we should look out for in the future. China is the United States' number one choice for outsourcing, and it has been for the last 30 years. I don't think that is going to change anytime soon. Unless Trump raises tariffs on Chinese products, companies will keep sending manufactured goods to China. India, on the other hand, will continue to grow in the service market. This is already happening. If you have had the misfortune of dealing with customer service in the last 5 years, you may have noticed that most of them are from India. India is



much cheaper to outsource to than to employ people here in the States. They also have a growing technology sector. As the Indian middle class expands, more people are getting access to the internet, and are therefore, getting influence over the market.

In my opinion, India will be a huge market in 20 years. They will have a massive amount of economic control as more people can live a comfortable middle class life, and they will want to buy more things. China wants to do the same, but they just don't have the population India does, and it is not growing as fast.

If you plan to invest in any companies from any country, I would suggest you choose an Indian tech company. Their market may be on the smaller side now, but in a few decades there will be a massive market for technology. Middle class citizens love to buy new and improved items that let them live a comfortable life, and technology does that for many people. China would also be a good market, but they have a shadow of a large government entity that makes it hard to introduce new products to the Chinese market. I expect to see India in the top 5 largest economies in the next 20 years, so invest wisely.





er young leaders to take a stand for our climate. There is a young girl, Leah Namugerwa, who lives in Uganda, a country which produces the smallest amount of pollution, but will be affected severely by climate instability. She wanted to start a global movement based on mass noncooperation to bring attention to the climate crisis. Leah was inspired by Greta Thunberg, but was truly moved to act after seeing the famine caused by drought and landslides in her country linked to climate change induced by other countries' fossil fuel emissions. Another example of the youth revolution is Xiye Bastida, who lives in New York. She was originally from Mexico and a member of the Otomi-Toltec indigenous people. Xiye is one of the lead organizers of the Fridays for Future U.S. youth climate strike movement. She says, "We are on Earth to take care of life. We are on Earth to take care of each other."

So why do these young activists receive so much hate and animosity for simply speaking the truth? We can see it time and time again throughout history. Leaders such as Gandhi and Martin Luther King Jr. speak the truth and are vehemently opposed or even hated in the moment, but in the future people look up to them and revere their words of wisdom. I believe the hatred comes out of fear of change and of course opposition to established industry practices. If we were to take action and stop extracting fossil fuels, those industries would suffer the most.

If you want to be more involved, you can join local movements such as the Oregon Youth Legislative Initiative for Climate Justice. This program allows youth to take part in lobbying at the state capitol for bills they support. You can talk face to face to your legislators and share your opinions and stories with them. Another national youth group is The Sunrise Movement, which works to endorse political candidates that support elimination of fossil fuels, and the creation of clean energy jobs. When we respect each other, and especially the voice of the youth who are willing to work together to make decisions based on scientific facts, we can have confidence in our shared future. As students, we should be encouraged by our peers and appreciate the leadership of these brave youth activists. Let us not rally behind hate, but embrace the truth, as it is the only way to get us out of this catastrophic climate crisis and to build a viable future.


