School Board Goals

1. Improve Student Achievement – All students will show growth in the core areas of Reading, Writing, and Math.

- Students in grades 3-8 and grade 11 will perform on the SBAC at or above Like-District Averages in the core subjects of Reading and Math.
- The percentage of Regular Attenders will increase by 5% in grade bands for K-3, 4-5, and by 7% in grade band 6-8, and 10% in grade band 9-12. The focus for the chronically absent will be to focus on increased attendance with the Economically Disadvantaged students.

2. To hire a highly qualified superintendent beginning the 2016-2017 school year.

- Open and post the application process by early October.
- Form a search committee with representation of the School Board, administration, staff, and community.
- Close the application deadline January 8, 2016.
- The search committee will hold interviews for chosen candidates and make a recommendation to the School Board for a second interview with finalists.
- School Board will conduct second interviews with finalists, schedule a meet and greet in Sweet Home, and organize site visits/phone interviews with people from finalist's home town.
- School Board will announce superintendent selection prior to Spring Break in March.

3. To create an Action Plan for Safe Routes to School for each of the four grade schools and Junior High.

- Contact Tarah Campi, Transportation Options Outreach Coordinator, Oregon Cascades West Council of Governments to provide guidance and expertise with the action plans.
- Form School Teams with representatives from the school, local government, and community.
- Assess the modes of student travel.
- Collect data of traffic volume, crash data, and crosswalk information.
- Summarize the findings.
- Identify the solutions and create an action plan.
- Implement the action plan where feasible.
