



- Mom has a shop that grooms pets. She washes dogs and cats, gives them haircuts, and makes them smell really nice.


I like to help Mom at her shop when I go there. There's just one problem. My little brother likes to help, too.

- Tommy just smiled that smile he smiled whenever something bad was going to happen.




Tommy and I washed FiFi in the sink.

The hair gel made FiFi fluffy.



"My, my," said Mrs. LaBoom. "FiFi looks so... so... festive."


- I smiled. "We thought we would do something special," I said. "After all, it is a holiday."
